1) How are Grades in band determined?

85% Semester Work

55% Professionalism/College & Career Readiness Band rehearsal, performances, and all activities within the band community

- This grade reflects upon the student's punctuality, engagement, contribution, and having all necessary materials at rehearsal, putting things away properly.
- Identify and navigate their personal, civic and social responsibilities to engage in local, national, and global contexts
- Engage in issues that are important to the local and global community
- Self-regulate, self-direct, self-identify strengths and areas for growth
- Reflect on feedback and take appropriate action based on feedback
- Demonstrate the ability to take initiative, use appropriate resources
- Manage Monitor and modify effort to accomplish goals
- Collaboration: Working with others interdependently to perform a task and achieve shared goals
- Listen with understanding and empathy to others expressing differing ideas or backgrounds
- Manage Impulsivity, being comfortable with delayed gratification as they strive for excellence.

30% Band Lessons

- Weekly lessons will consist of an individualized program for each student.
- Lessons will be one-on-one or in small groups
- Lessons will consist of guided instruction by a staff &/or focused personal practice.
- The focus of lessons might be, but not limited to: instrument technique, concert music, All-State preparations, solo/ensemble preparations, college audition preparations, jazz improvisation, etc.
- All brass and woodwind musicians should the technique book: <u>Rubank</u>
 <u>Advanced Method Vol 1 or 2</u> specifically for his/her instrument.
 Students can obtain this book from Rieman Music, or available on Smartmusic.com for a subscription fee, or other reputable music dealer.
- Some students will undertake projects that may require other materials, such as the All-State Audition and solo/ensemble preparations.

 Students will also have major and chromatic scale targets defined per grade level and/or ensemble.

Exemptions:

Students taking weekly private lessons with a professional on the same instrument need only <u>submit a voucher</u> from their private instructor (voucher form available on the band website – "Lessons" tab)

15% Class Assignments

- Written and listening assignments, writing concert reviews, rehearsal reflections, etc.
- Performing and/or recording excerpts of band music alone
- Performing and/or recording excerpts of band music with section mates
- Performing and/or recording specific scale assignments
- Performing specific skills related to marching band

15% Final Exam

Based on the final exam period rehearsal participation.

2) What do Grades in band mean?

The students' grades should reflect their accomplishments in learning/developing/mastering the skills & concepts set forth in the class curriculum.

Who are Grades for?(Who are the target audiences of Grades in Band?)

Students – as an indicator of their accomplishments in learning/developing/mastering the skills & concepts set forth in the class curriculum.

Parents - as an indicator of their child's accomplishments in learning/developing/mastering the skills & concepts set forth in the class curriculum.

Colleges/Scholarships/Future Employers - as an indicator of a student's accomplishments in learning/developing/mastering the skills & concepts set forth in the class curriculum. It also serves as a general indicator of a student's achievement relative to other students' achievement when considering candidates for scholarship, acceptance to colleges, or employment.
